French mezzo-sorpano Marie Elizabeth Seager studied at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London.

Her opera roles include Charlotte, Idamante, Ramiro, Waltraute, The Sorceress (*Dido and Aeneas*), as well as Mrs Grose and Ms Jessel (*The Turn of the Screw*).

Past engagements include *Gioconda* (Laura) and *Dialogues des Carmélites* (Mère Marie) with Midsummer Opera in London. In 2019, she covered the second and third "Weird Sisters" in the world première of Pascal Dusapin's *Macbeth Underworld* at La monnaie in Brussels.

Ms Seager is often engaged for concerts and recitals. Works she has performed include, but are not limited to: Bach's *Matthew Passion*; Handel's *Messiah*; Rossini's *Little solemn Mass* and *Stabat Mater*; the Requiems of Mozart, Duruflé und Christopher Wood; and Elgar's oratorio *The Kingdom*.
